Bob Hankins, the son of a United Methodist Pastor, spent his early years in southwest Virginia and east Tennessee. He graduated from high school in Marion, Virginia. He graduated from Asbury College in Kentucky and Princeton Theological Seminary in New Jersey in preparation for his years of service as a Pastor in the United Methodist Church.

He served as a Student Pastor from 1955 until 1960 when he was ordained. During his years in ministry he served churches in Ohio (3 years), Connecticut (7 years), and New York (35 years). He has also served as a Chaplain at the Veteran's Administration Hospital in Montrose, New York for 9 years.

In retirement in North Carolina, he served the United Methodist Church in Hallsboro as an interim pastor for a year. At the Whiteville United Methodist Church, he has been a member of the Chancel Choir and has taught a Church School Class (Christians Under Construction) for 15 years. He has also taken an active part in leading work teams to Mississippi, Florida, North Carolina, Kentucky, Tennessee and Virginia. He lives on West College street with Carolyn, his wife of 54 years.
