LENT AND LEAVE-TAKING

For hundreds of years, Christian communities around the world have observed the religious season known as "Lent." Its general purpose has been for spiritual reflection—to deepen one's devotion through practices that remind us of Jesus' self-giving and sacrifice. The forty days of Lent (minus the Sundays) represent the story of Jesus spending forty days in the wilderness, tempted by the devil, before he began his public ministry.

In recent years, more and more Presbyterian congregations have engaged in Lenten activities—such as Ash Wednesday worship (this year, on March 1st), Holy Week services, and focused devotional reading and prayer. We do them, not to beat ourselves up for not measuring up, nor to impress each other or God. Rather, Lent gives us one of those opportunities to open ourselves more fully to growing and learning as a follower of The Way (see Acts 9:2 and 19:9).

For Beverly and me, Lent this year offers spiritual reflection of a particular kind. March is our last month as Interim Co-Pastors for First Presbyterian Church, Whiteville. We came here in September 2015 to help you travel the inbetween journey known as a pastoral vacancy. As we have tried to emphasize, this in-between time is not about treading water but strengthening the congregation, as it anticipates new pastoral ministry. You are a resourceful congregation in many ways, and your own growth now will serve you well in your next pastoral chapter.

Yet the two of us knew that we would not be the ones to open this chapter with you. Our purpose has been more like that of a midwife, helping new life come to birth. And, although that new pastor is not yet visible on the horizon, Beverly and I have concluded that our vocation draws us away from here. The coaching ministry in the Presbytery of Coastal Carolina is near and dear to us, and we need more time to devote to it. We are aware that we will be serving churches still, but now as coaches—and now even more so also for pastors and church officers.

Thus, our Lenten journey clearly becomes one of transition. The two of us have appreciated, more than you might realize, walking this journey with you. We have been blessed by your faith and generosity. We pray that you will be open to the leading of the Spirit as your next pastor joins you. Perhaps this is what will make Lent a significant moment this year—to grow in readiness for what God might call you to do and be, as you continue "To be a light in our community, reflecting Christ's love and compassion."

Lenten journeys, like all others, bear some uncertainty. So it is with Beverly and me; so it is with this church. Let yourselves be surprised by blessings coming your way, blessings that you might not expect.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Whiteville, met for its stated monthly meeting on Wednesday, February 8th, at 6:30 p.m. Among the items on the agenda, Session:

- Affirmed the revised decision to structure the Session Committees this year, as follows: Worship; Spiritual
 Development and Outreach; Membership, Visitation, and Evangelism (MVE); Congregational Life Committee
 (CLC); and Nuts and Bolts
- Clarified terms for the inactive members roll
- Approved a social media request form, to be used by any member requesting that information be shared via congregational social media
- Approved purchase of up to \$7,500, to be taken from Capital Reserves, for video and related equipment that
 will be used to provide live Internet streaming of Sunday worship and other congregational events; approved
 invitation to church members to donate money for these purchases
- Authorized the Worship Committee to fill the pulpit beginning April 2nd, until such time as other arrangements are necessary
- Heard that the final 2016 operating expenses were only \$77.00 over pledged and unpledged income
- Approved a 2017 operating budget of \$234,000, with a small deficit of \$4,000 (as was reported later at the annual congregational meeting)
- Set the date of the annual congregational meeting for February 22nd, at the Family Night Supper
