- BIBLE STUDY: I am excited to invite you to join us for "Wednesdays Together" Bible Study beginning Wednesday, November 8! This is a study for ALL adults...and I hope you will invite your friends and neighbors. We will gather at 6:30, in the Fellowship Hall, for a time of fellowship and exploring God's Word!

Our first study will be "Fear Free Evangelism". Session Meeting

The Session of First Presbyterian Church, Whiteville, met on Wednesday, October 11, 2017, moderated by Rev. Dr. Joseph D. Washburn. Items discussed were:

1. Dr. Washburn reported on his activities during the prior month. He continued to encourage the session to stay connected and involved.
 2. Hospice gave a copier to our church and the clerk sent them a thank you note for the donation.
 3. A review of the current year to date statement of income and expenditures, including an increase in giving since Joe arrived. The stewardship campaign will be kicked off with the fish fry October 25, 2017.
 4. \$500 has been approved to purchase TV equipment for the nursery.
 5. Nominees for Elders for the 2018 election will be completed soon.
 6. A multimedia policy.
 7. Securing an annual copyright license for print, audio and video and include in the budget starting in 2018.
 8. The baptism of River Langdon Scott, son of Katherine and Ethan Scott, on November 26, 2017.
 9. Hosting the community wide Thanksgiving Service the Sunday before Thanksgiving, 2017.
 10. Approved the use of the Pastor's Loan Fund in the amount of approximately \$27,911.00 for the purchase of a home by Joe Washburn. Specifics for the loan will be worked out by Joe Washburn and the Nuts and Bolts committee prior to closing on the home.
 11. Approved to call a congregational meeting to: 1) Reduce the number of elders from five to four for each class of elders. and 2) Elect the elders for the class of 2018.
 12. Request for the ladies of FPC to use the church crib nursery as a Ladies Exercise Room.
 13. Approved a gifts and memorials committee as a subcommittee to the Worship Committee.

This program aims to outfit people in Uganda with shoes to prevent jiggers in feet, and to provide a sustainable job and income for Ugandans. The party will be held in the fall, and even though a date has not been finalized, there is a way to help now. Each shoe pattern we send off needs to be sponsored for \$10--this includes shipping, extra materials, and payment for the Tailors and Shoemakers. 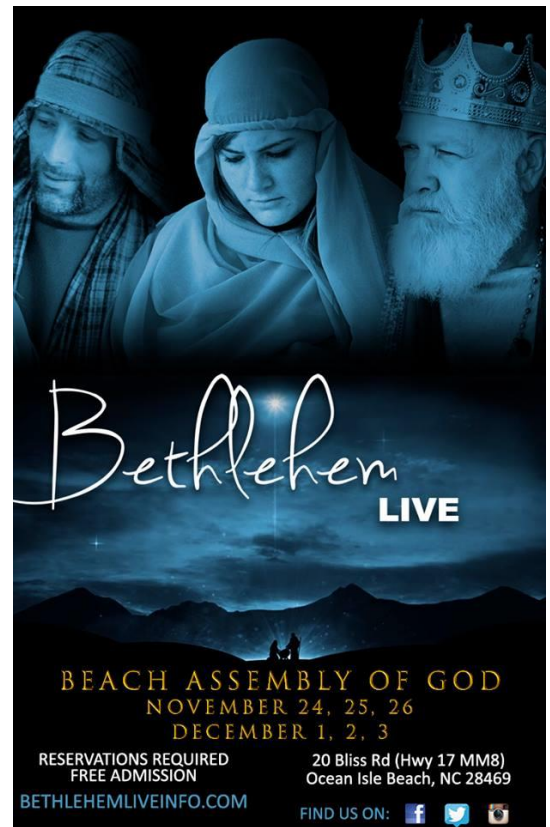
How to Pack a Shoebox

Decide whether you will pack a box for a girl or a boy, and the age category: 2–4, 5–9, or 10–14.</p>	<p>3 Fill with Gifts Select a medium to large "wow" item such as a soccer ball with pump or stuffed animal, then fill with other fun toys, hygiene items, and school supplies.</p>
<p>4 Pray Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift. You can also include a personal note and photo.</p>	<p>5 Follow Your Box Labels Donate \$9 online and receive a tracking label to Follow Your Box and discover the destination of your shoebox gift.</p>	<p>6 Drop-Off Take your shoebox gift to the church office during National Collection Week, November 13–20.</p>
