Hymn of the Month:

Our Hymn of the month for August is a rather new hymn, "Let Us Talents and Tongues Employ". I believe this hymn, written in 1975, made its debut into Presbyterian hymnal with the blue Presbyterian Hymnal, published in 1990. The musical setting of this hymn is a Jamaican folk melody. The author of the text describes this piece as a "communion calypso" and it affirms the continuing presence of Christ both in the sacramental meal and in the lives of Christians. The text reflects his deeply held conviction that an act of worship such as the Lord's Supper needs to be completed by the active ministry of the church in the world, for this is how we show love for God and neighbor. This dual understanding is perhaps most concisely expressed in the first line of the third stanza, "Jesus calls us in, sends us out". This is a great hymn that is hard to sing without a little bounce in your legs and a smile on your face!
